Lara Lake Primary School makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.

Lara Lake Primary School Council will annually review parent payments requested to ensure they are in line with Department of Education & Training guidelines. Charges will be clearly itemised, costed and categorised as:

- Essential Student Learning,
- Optional Items or
- Voluntary Financial Contributions.

Payment Methods

Payment Option	Explanation	How to set this up...
 CompassPay	Compass software is a 'one stop' communication system. Our aim is to streamline communication to and from school. Accessed via web browser or the free app, this enables paperless consent and payment for school-based activities to save parent's time.	Make payments using a credit card, allows you to have an individual child's payment record within the app. Individual login access required. App is available for Smartphones from the App Store.  BPay	Payment made directly to the school by using your Bpay Biller Code and Reference Number. This can be done as needed or set as a regular payment instalment.	Make payments using your bank account's online banking function, with your BPay Biller Code and Reference Number found on your Family Statement.
 Centrepay	Centrelink will take payments out of your fortnightly benefit and transfer it to the school. This can be done as a once off or regularly. Cash, Cheque, EFTPOS or Credit Card	Cash or cheques directly to the office. EFTPOS machine at the office.	Phone the office to pay over the phone using your credit card. Payments can be made at the School Office. <i>** If COVID Government Restrictions allow.</i>
Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)	Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply for funding \$125 per student to assist with the cost of Camps Sports and Excursions.	Applications can be made at the School Office until June for this yearly fund. Eligibility: the parent/carer card must be valid on the first day Term 1 (28 th January 2021) or Term 2 (19 th April 2021)

Suggested Schedule

Payments can be made anytime from now to the dates listed:

- Payment in full in readiness of the school year; Thursday, 28th January 2021
- Instalments:
 - Term 1 50% Thursday, 28th January 2021
 - Term 2 25% Monday, 19th April 2021
 - Term 3 25% Monday, 12th July 2021
- Other arrangements including Payment Plans.

Refunds

Refunds are to be requested in writing to the office or by email sent to: lara.lake.ps@education.vic.gov.au

Essential Items:

- Fully refundable if paid in the preceding year and the student does not commence at Lara Lake Primary School.
- Pro-rata per terms following exit date, e.g. exit middle term 1, then terms 2-4 will be refunded.
- Nil refund after the commencement of term 4.

Optional Items:

Students withdrawing from camps and excursions, optional item activities will not automatically be entitled to a refund.

- Full refund will be payable where NO COST is incurred by the school when:
 - It is viable the school can approve another student to fill the place
 - The Principal deems the student's withdrawal is unavoidable e.g. Illness with a medical certificate presented.
- Partial refund will be payable when:
 - The Principal deems the student's withdrawal is unavoidable. In such case, the refund will be the amount paid, less any expenses incurred by the school because of the withdrawal
- No refund will be payable when:
 - The Principal deems the student's withdrawal was avoidable and/or the school has incurred the full cost of the excursion/incursion, camp, extra-curricular activity, or optional activity.
- Camps and Swimming Program:
 - Due to planning and advance payment to confirm bookings, a medical certificate is required for the period of the activity before a refund is considered. The refund will be the amount paid less any expenses incurred by the school because of the withdrawal.

Voluntary Contributions:

Voluntary contributions are only refundable when paid in the preceding year and the student does not commence the school year.

Overview: Parent Payment Policy

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
